## WHAT IS THE PURPOSE OF THE COVID-19 RESEARCH CLINIC?

Research on long-term health consequences of post-COVID-19 are few and limited. Understanding and expanding the knowledge of the short- and long-term physical and mental health consequences of COVID-19 can help to identify approaches to early identification and interventions that reduce illness and death due to COVID-19 infection.

The COVID-19 Research Clinic is a multi-disciplinary collaboration between the Louisville community and the Center of Excellence for Research in Infectious Diseases at the University of Louisville aimed to define and evaluate the short- and long-term health consequences of COVID-19 for patients who have survived an infection.

The COVID-19 research clinic is a free clinic focusing on research to learn about the consequences of COVID-19 and does not provide treatment. If treatment is necessary, please seek medical advice from a primary care provider or a corresponding specialist. No referrals will be provided at the COVID-19 research clinic.

## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What can I expect as a participant?

Once you are enrolled in the research clinic, the study will require you to schedule a visit for assessment. As a participant you will:

- Provide laboratory specimens such as blood, urine, sputum and stool
- Complete questionnaires
- Grant permission to access medical records

### What are the benefits?

- Provide scientific evidence of possible long-term health effects of COVID-19 infection
- Help reduce the burden of COVID-19

### Are there any risks to participating?

Anticipated risks could include those resulting from having your blood drawn or a breach of confidentiality with respect to your study data.

All information collected will be used for research purposes only. Your information will remain confidential.

## SEEKING CLINIC PARTICIPANTS

If you have had a confirmed past COVID-19 infection, you may be eligible to participate in the COVID-19 Research Clinic.
